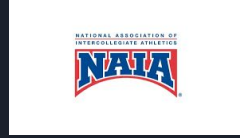

NCAA, NAIA, NJCAA



NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) and NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) are both college athletic governing bodies.

The NCAA is generally larger, with more well-known programs and three divisions (I, II, and III), while the NAIA is typically smaller, often with private institutions, and has two divisions. The NCAA has stricter eligibility requirements, while the NAIA offers more flexibility in recruiting and eligibility.

NJCAA (National Junior College Athletic Association) are the 2 year colleges.

If you want to play sports in college you need to be cleared by NCAA, NAIA, or NJCAA .

You will want to create your profiles when you are entering into High School. If you have not done so, create a profile ASAP!
